Martin Luther King had two parents your father was minister and your mother was a schoolteacher, and your father was a ministeur.




At only fifteen years old MLK entered at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia. 1944




It's the start of the Segregation. black and white people couldn't live together, there were separate facilities (toilets, schools, public transports ...) for black and white people. 1870
